


## COMMUNITY RESILIENCE FUND

COVID-19 ACTION ALERT | March 2021



A year later, COVID-19 continues to take a toll on our nonprofit community. In a report from almost 200 nonprofit grantees, they estimate a revenue loss of \$46 million in 2021. The Community Resilience Fund is dedicated to supporting Omaha-area organizations serving communities disproportionately affected by the pandemic.

Arts organizations that received Douglas County CARES Act grant funding needed approximately **\$23 million** to get through 2020.

**50+** eviction cases filed weekly since fall in Douglas County. This is **2x higher** than normal, according to data from Nebraska Legal Aid.






of Nebraskans recently reported feeling symptoms of anxiety or depression, up from 11% in 2019. <sup>2</sup>
