



2025 Impact Report

Philanthropy isn't just about giving. It's about creating the future we want to see. In 2025, we partnered with donors, organizations, and everyday changemakers to meet urgent needs and invest in long-term solutions.

Together, we distributed **\$315.8 million** across 19,000 grants, supporting work that strengthens our community. Of those dollars, **72% stayed in the Omaha Metro**.

As longtime fundholders, the McMeekins have supported causes they care about while staying closely connected to local needs.

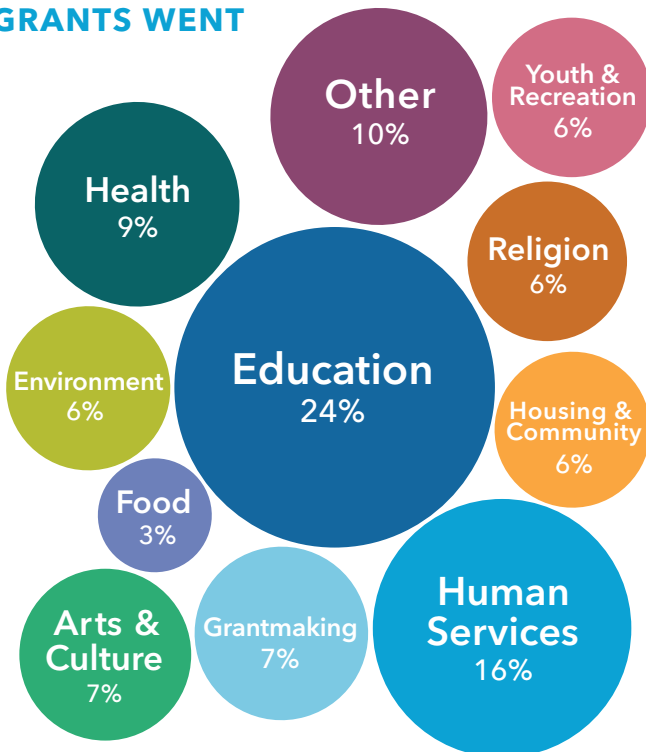
"The Foundation offers insight into local issues and organizations we might not have known about otherwise," Mike said. "It helps us give more effectively."

OPEN A FUND

Charitable Checkbook®: Start with an initial contribution of \$1,000 or more. Use the funds to support your favorite nonprofits without any annual fees or charges.

Donor Advised Fund: Open with a minimum of \$25,000. You can contribute and recommend grants over time, with immediate tax deduction benefits. Your donation is invested to potentially grow your impact.

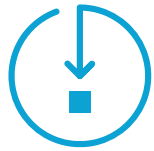
Field of Interest Fund: Requires a \$100,000 donation. Supports specific areas of interest by evaluating and granting to organizations that align with your chosen cause, creating a lasting legacy or honoring a loved one.

Designated Fund: Personalized for a specific purpose or activity, allowing support for a particular organization through a single gift or recurring grants.

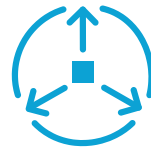


Fall Fundholder Event at Steelhouse Omaha

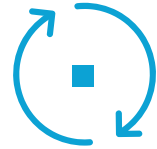

MATCHING RESOURCES TO COMMUNITY NEED

Late last year, food insecurity increased across the Omaha Metro, placing strain on food banks, pantries, and community-based service providers. As nonprofits reported growing demand, we shared timely, nonprofit-informed guidance with our fundholders, helping them respond quickly with confidence.

In a matter of days, support reached organizations addressing food access for families, seniors, refugees, and individuals with specific dietary needs.

- ▶ **\$122,690** donated to the Food Relief Fund by 86 people
- ▶ **\$1.86 million** donated directly to nonprofits by 145 fundholders
